

Primary School Sport Funding

The aim of this extra funding is to impact positively on pupils' lifestyles and physical well being. Schools may use this funding to:

- Increase the participation rates in sports activities
- Increase participation in, and success in, competitive school sports
- Ensure that the PE curriculum is inclusive
- Increase the range and breadth of sporting activities
- Work in partnership on PE with other schools
- Make links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- Increase awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other risks to their health

Primary School Sport Funding Allocation 2013/2014 - £9,440

The school used this extra funding to:

- Fund the cost of the subscription to the Dartmoor School Sport Partnership
- Subsidise the salary costs of employing our School Sports Coach

Impact

Data and other evidence shows:

- Increased participation by the vast majority of pupils in sports activities
- Many successes in competitive sport across the year and across a range of different sports
- The school has achieved the Gold Kitemark award for the second year running in recognition of the breadth and quality of the PE curriculum and extra-curricular activities
- Involvement in the School Sport Partnership has enabled children to participate in PE activities with other local schools
- Staff have accessed CPD through the School Sport Partnership which has impacted positively on PE teaching within the school
- All pupils have accessed an increasing range of Sports activities, including pupils from vulnerable groups and those in receipt of the Pupil Premium
